Immersion A block of time dedicated to language "immersion" is an opportunity for students to acquire and experience a distinct separation with clear boundaries of modes.	Acquisition Language acquired through a subconscious process during which they are unaware of grammatical rules. Language acquisition means "picking it up" (i.e., developing ability in a language by using it in natural, communicative situations).
Learning Learning language as a conscious activity. Direct instruction in the rules of language & purposefully studying lists of vocabulary and grammar forms. Not age appropriate activity for young children.	Integration/ Translanguaging Teachers and staff focus on developing students' "multilingual skills" by addressing ASL, spoken English, AAC, and literacy in lesson planning and during instruction.
